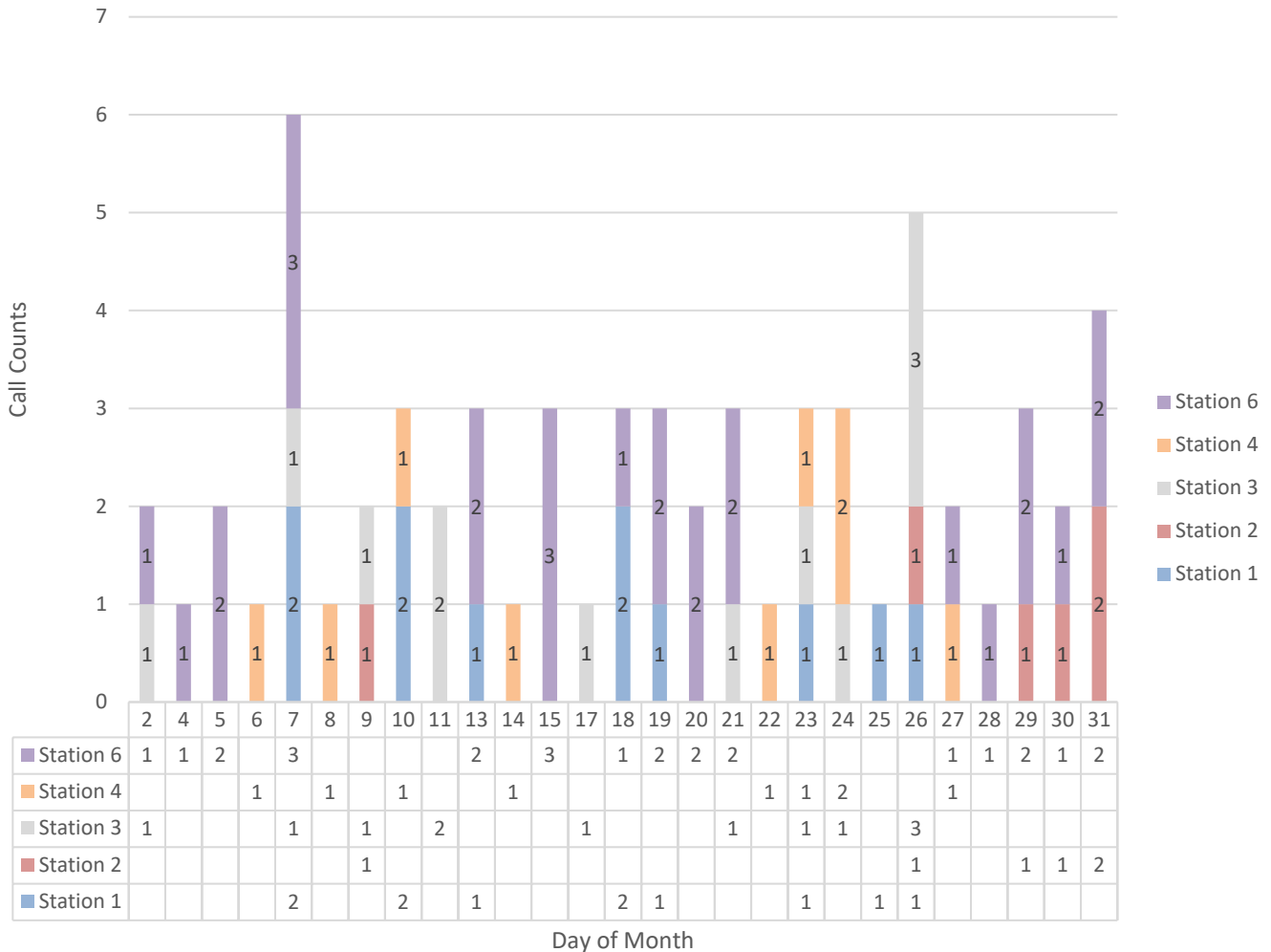

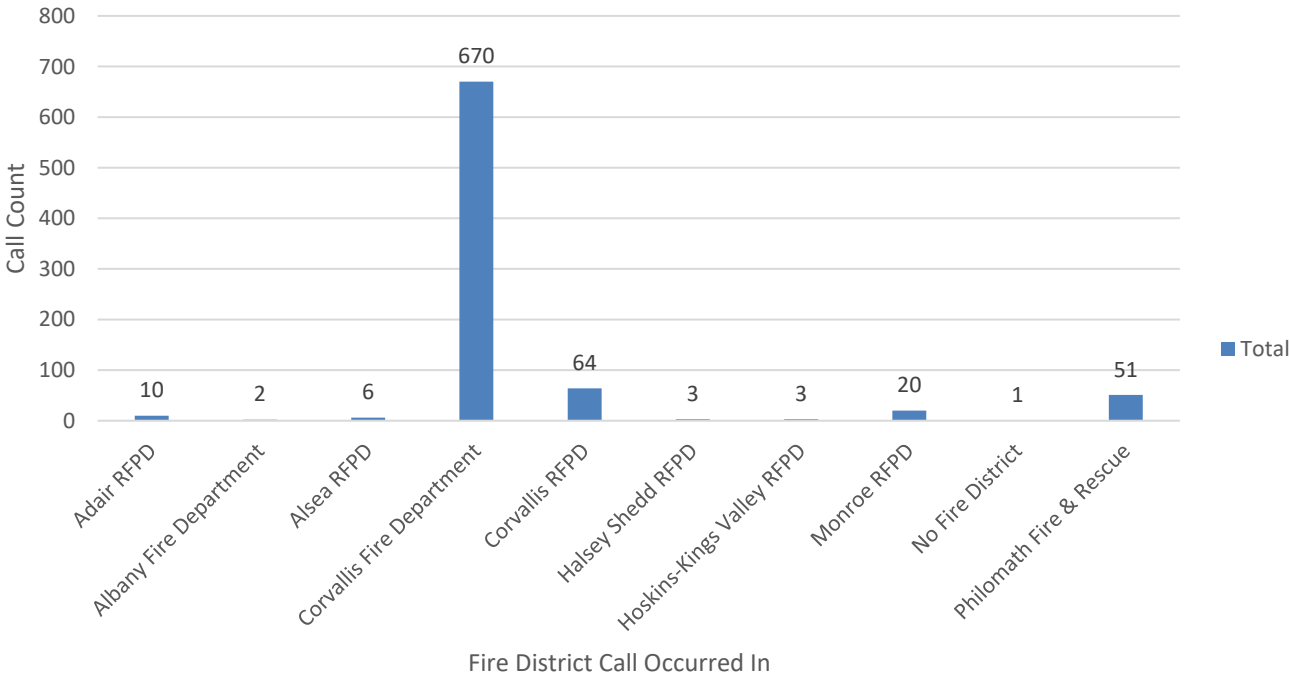

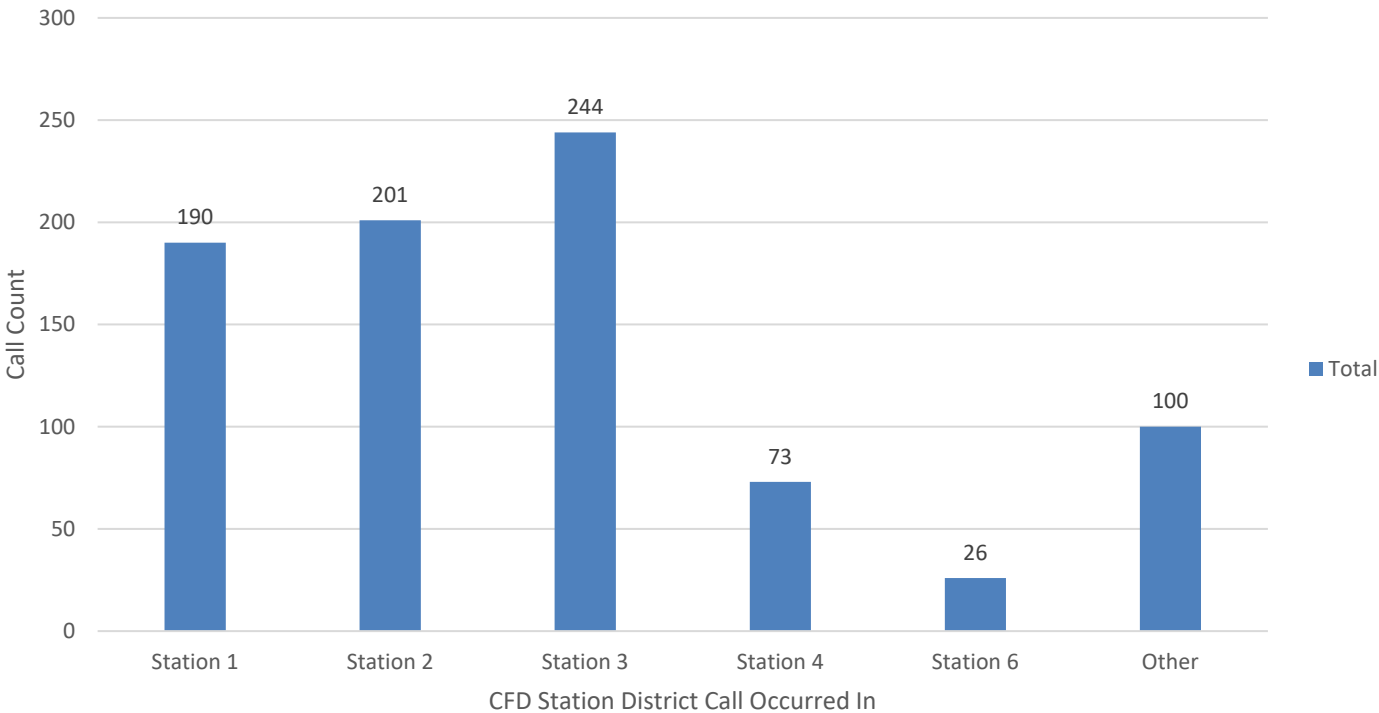
CRFPD Call Counts by Days of May 2024 and CRFPD Station District



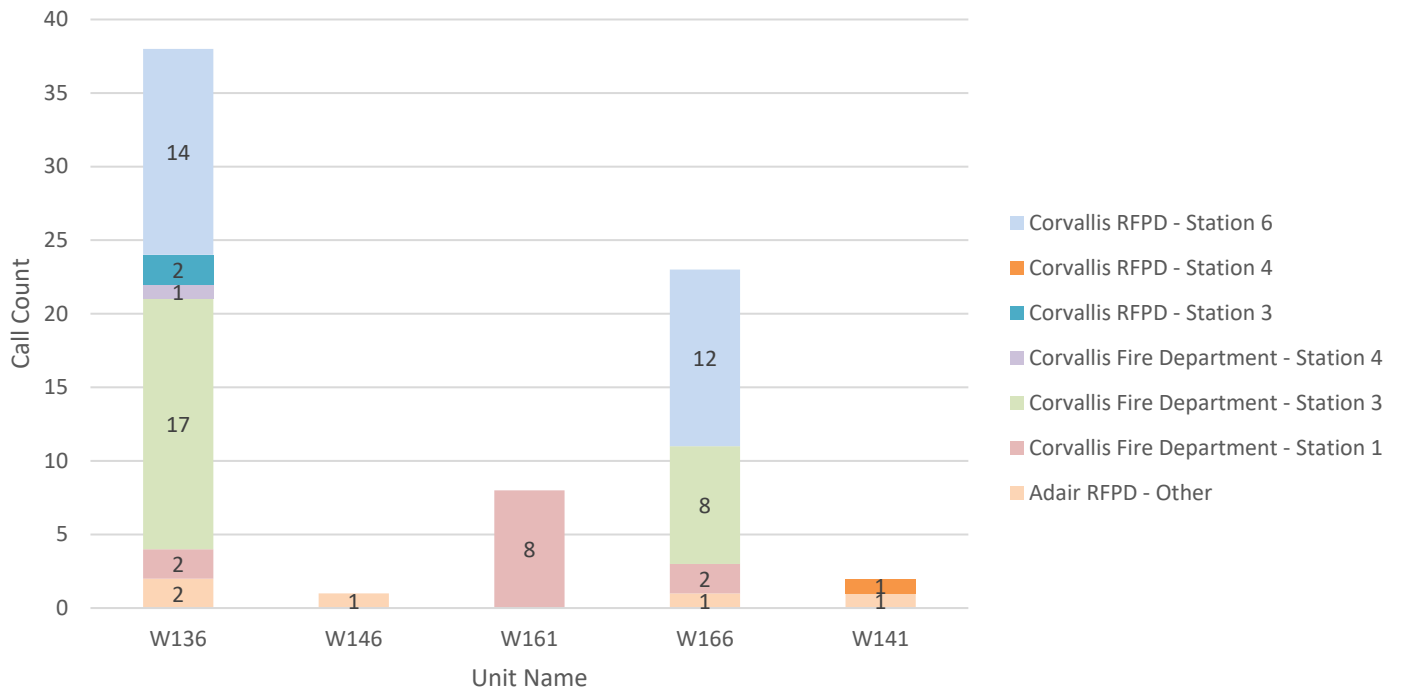
CFD Call Count by Fire District Call Occurred in for May 2024

STATION 6 LIEUTENANT'S REPORT

Maintenance:

Old Issues-

- Grease leak discovered in South dorm hallway, awaiting a return call from Middleton to schedule service.
Update: Middleton recommended a cleaning service provider come clean the system. Apex Hood Cleaning

was hired and found several deficiencies in the system during their service. Recommendations were forwarded on to Bob.

- Rural Boardwalk through performed, findings included several items needing attention: some mattresses need replaced, window blinds in several rooms, bathroom vent repair from electrician, men's bathroom painting, fitness door hinge repair, refrigerator seal replacement. **Update: Crews are requesting curtains in replacement of the blinds as we replace the identified blinds. This will help with light control into the rooms while sleeping. After reviewing cost difference, curtains would be the lesser cost. I will move forward on this if there is no opposition. Bob has update from Butts Electric regarding bathroom fans. Still pending door hinge repair.**

New Issues-

- Well pump and holding tank. Several instances of loss of water pressure to the station this past week led to Stutzman coming to evaluate the well and pump situation. Stutzman's findings were relayed to Bob and included a recommendation of a new well being drilled. Stutzman is unable to compile any quote of the pump and tank for the new well until after the well is drilled due to several factors that won't be determined until then. Corvallis Drilling has been contacting and I am waiting on a return call for scheduling. No quote yet.
- Due to well issues and receiving less than 8 GPM from the current well, the 30,000-gallon water tank is out of service for drafting operations. The tank is near full now and will supply the Fire Suppression system but will not self-fill because the re-fill valve was closed to allow the little water coming from well to supply the house.
- Drainage problems with the shower and kitchen sink. Evenflo Plumbing was out here once again to snake the shower drains, as they seem to back up about once a month. After evaluation of the system, they recommended removing the disposal under the kitchen sink and installing a basket Strainer in its place. This should help with drain clogging. This work was completed 6/25.
- Bark/River Rock project. Station landscape in need of work. Recommending being in line with OSU Defensible Space and Fuel Reduction Guide and creating 5 ft non-combustible space around the house by replacing bark with rock. Tony has been my contact on this project, and we are prepared to go whatever direction the board decides.
